## Reasonable Accommodations for Students with Medical Concerns Regarding Masks

#### Introduction

Rowan College at Burlington County's (RCBC) top priority is your safety. The college has continued to implement specific measures, outlined on the college website, to minimize the risk of spreading coronavirus on our campus.

At RCBC, everyone is required to wear a mask, including inside buildings and in classrooms, as directed by the state. Anyone who refuses to wear a mask will be asked to leave campus. Students who do not wear a mask may also face charges under the college's <u>Code of Conduct</u> procedure.

### Reasonable accommodations protocol:

For the health and safety of all students and employees, RCBC provides the option for online instruction as a reasonable accommodation for any student who is unable to wear a mask on campus. Due to specific health and safety requirements issued by the state, no exceptions can be made for Health Science students in clinically based programs or any culinary program. For students in other courses, RCBC may also allow students the following reasonable accommodations:

- wearing a scarf, loose face covering, or full face shield instead of a face mask
- alternative options for services or coursework by telephone or video calls

#### **Accommodation Request Process:**

If a student has a need to request an accommodation for wearing a face mask on campus, a request can be filed, in writing, to the Office of Student Support at <a href="mailto:studentsupport@rcbc.edu">studentsupport@rcbc.edu</a>. The request must include the reasons for the student request, the course information and the medical documentation that qualifies for this accommodation request.

Official medical documentation for the request must:

- 1. Be provided by a qualified medical professional
- 2. Typed on professional's letterhead
- 3. Include name, title, credentials and contact information of professional
- 4. Signed and Dated (with current date)
- 5. Verify that the individual
  - a. meets the ADA definition of disability (i.e., has a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or more major life activities); or
  - b. Describe the needed modification; or



c. Show the relationship between the individual's disability and the need for the requested modification

In the event that an accommodation related to face mask coverings is granted, the approved student will be required to sign an agreement with the Office of Student Support and carry an approval letter with them at all times on campus for display to any official college employee.

If a student would like to appeal an Office of Student Support Accommodation decision, they can file an appeal with the Dean of Student Success at <a href="mailto:cbc.edu">cbc.edu</a>.
