



AFTER THE SEMESTER STARTS


- Have you read your syllabi?

- Go into Self-Service and look at My Progress to plan fall, summer and spring courses to be prepared to meet with an advisor







- Speak with Financial Aid or Student Accounts to make sure costs are covered.
