The Guaranteed Admissions Program

BCC students have the opportunity to earn direct admission into Richard Stockton College of New Jersey provided they fulfill the following criteria:

1. Declaration of intent to enroll in the Guaranteed Admissions Program prior to registering for 30 credits at BCC.
2. Completion of the designated Associate of Arts or Associate of Science degree at Burlington County College. *Please note: All degree credits must be earned at BCC.*
3. Attainment of a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 at BCC
4. The student's course of study at BCC follows the recommended transfer program for the intended major at Richard Stockton College of N.J.
5. The application for admission to Richard Stockton College of N.J. is submitted in accordance with the normal admissions procedure and timetable.

Please Note: Guaranteed Admission only applies to designated BCC major courses of study (see attached) that lead to specific Richard Stockton College majors. Admission to this program does not guarantee admission into the Bachelor of Arts in Teacher Education at Richard Stockton College. This program is a second baccalaureate degree which has additional entrance requirements.

Degree Requirements / Time Limits

Students enrolled in the Burlington County College – Richard Stockton College of N.J. Guaranteed Admissions Program must complete the AA or AS degree within three years of the date of enrollment in the program.

Enrollment in the Guaranteed Admissions Program

1. Students who are currently attending BCC and who wish to join the program must complete the attached *Intent to Transfer* form and submit it to the Transfer Center in TEC 104 on the Mt. Laurel campus.
2. Students who submit the Intent to Transfer form must make an appointment to meet with the BCC Transfer Coordinator as soon as possible after they submit the form.
3. While a student at BCC, every student enrolled in the Guaranteed Admissions Program must meet with the Transfer Coordinator each semester to assure appropriate course selections are made to satisfy both BCC graduation and transfer requirements.
4. BCC students who are enrolled in the Guaranteed Admissions Program with Richard Stockton College of N.J. are not permitted to change their major course of study without losing their eligibility for the GAP. Therefore, students need to be very certain about their intended major at Richard Stockton College of N.J.
5. Approximately six (6) months prior to graduation from BCC, students enrolled in the Guaranteed Admissions Program will be instructed by the Transfer Coordinator about the transfer process for GAP students.
6. Please note that BCC students are under no obligation to Richard Stockton College of N.J. unless, and until, they choose to enroll at Richard Stockton College of N.J. Participation in the Guaranteed Admissions Program means that you will follow a specific plan of study that leads to transfer to an outstanding college. However, should you wish, you may certainly transfer to another institution.
