LIFE offers adults 50 years or older the opportunity to pursue informal educational goals. LIFE classes are taught by volunteers.

Membership

A LIFE membership entitles members to take as many courses as they wish during the eligible semesters. A membership year runs from September 1 to August 31. The cost of membership is \$80. A Summer-only (June 1 through August 31) membership is reduced to \$55. Membership fees are payable to RCBC/LIFE, and mailed to the LIFE program coordinator at LIFE, Rowan College at Burlington County, 900 College Circle, Mt. Laurel, NJ 08054.

**Payment is only required for new participants in the 2022-2023 program year.

Refund Policy

No refunds for LIFE membership are given after the first class session. Under mitigating circumstances, new members may petition a request for a refund if they have not attended any LIFE courses.

Classes

All LIFE classes are taught by volunteers. In most cases, there should be a minimum of ten (10) students to conduct a class and the maximum is set by the instructor. When course registration dips as low as five members, there may be times when no one shows up for class. LIFE instructors will often set their minimum and maximum class size.

A special note about attending class at Evergreens: The Evergreens requires visitors to check in at the new Welcome House to be screened. Visitors must answer a series of questions that will include vaccination status. Course Outline:

Week 5: Women in the Arts. Documentary: "The Passionate Pursuits of Angela Bowen."

Week 6: Showing a live movie at the Library: "The Immortal Life of Henrietta Lacks".

Week 7: Since we will be at the Library, let's talk about the important role they have played and continue to play. .There are right wing attacks on free access to books!

Week 8: Guns in America, .leading to violence against children including increased suicide rates.

Week 9: The right to our bodies.
